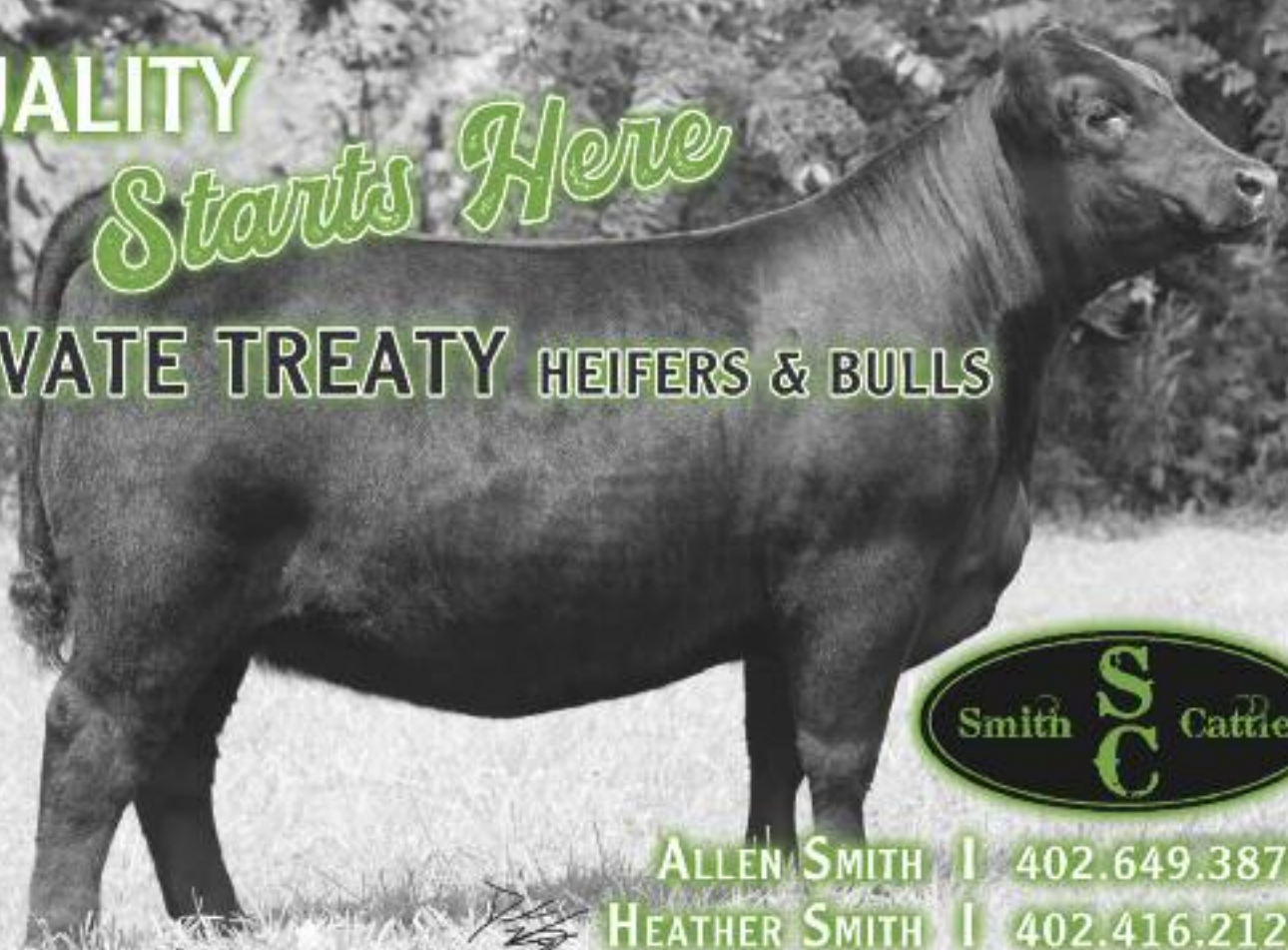

Dear Nebraska Angus Friends,

Hope all is going well for everyone!

The 2021 Beef Improvement Federation Research Symposium & Convention was held in June at Des Moines, Iowa, hosted by the good folks at Iowa State University. BIF symposiums bring a wide variety of cattle producers and academia together to discuss research findings and applications for the beef industry.

As always, a Young Producer session kicked off the conference. This is a great opportunity for the younger generation to hear speakers with information that may pertain to start-up issues in their operations. Topics included Managing for Profitability, Building a Brand, and Keeping Balance for the Long Haul.

In the general sessions, there were a number of speakers of note. Michael Uetz of Midan Marketing, discussed his firm's findings with regard to the various types of beef-buying customers and their habits. He illustrated the differences in marketing beef to various age groups and segments of consumers; what they look for when buying beef, and what kind of advertising platforms can be used to reach each segment.

It rang true as someone who still sees advertising via television and through the newspaper, versus our kids who don't have a TV subscription, and get the vast majority of their news via some type of online feed. Times have changed, and the beef industry needs to be flexible so that the message of our tasty and nutritious product reaches all consumers!

Also, a surprising session (considering the nature of the conference) was from hog producer Jim Pillen of northeast Nebraska. He presented genetic lessons from the swine industry, and we all garnered subsequent opportunities for application to the beef industry. Species that turn generations so quickly provide a great deal of insight to cattle producers.



There were also interesting presentations of new technologies, including from Nebraska's Reiss Bruning who applies behavior-monitoring ear tags to his heifers to assist with heat detection. This cutting-edge technology requires strong internet service, and he joked that Elon Musk (and his futuristic StarLink system) will soon be fixing that problem for all of us. Let's hope!

Other sessions included information about gene editing and cloning, and numerous break-out sessions were provided that discussed advancements in the following areas: Genomics and Genetic Prediction, Producer Applications, Efficiency and Adaptability, Emerging Technology, End-Product Improvement, and Selection Decisions.

I would encourage anyone who may be interested in these kinds of presentations to consider attending an annual BIF Conference. The location changes each year, and when they are as close as Iowa, it's definitely worth the time and the drive.

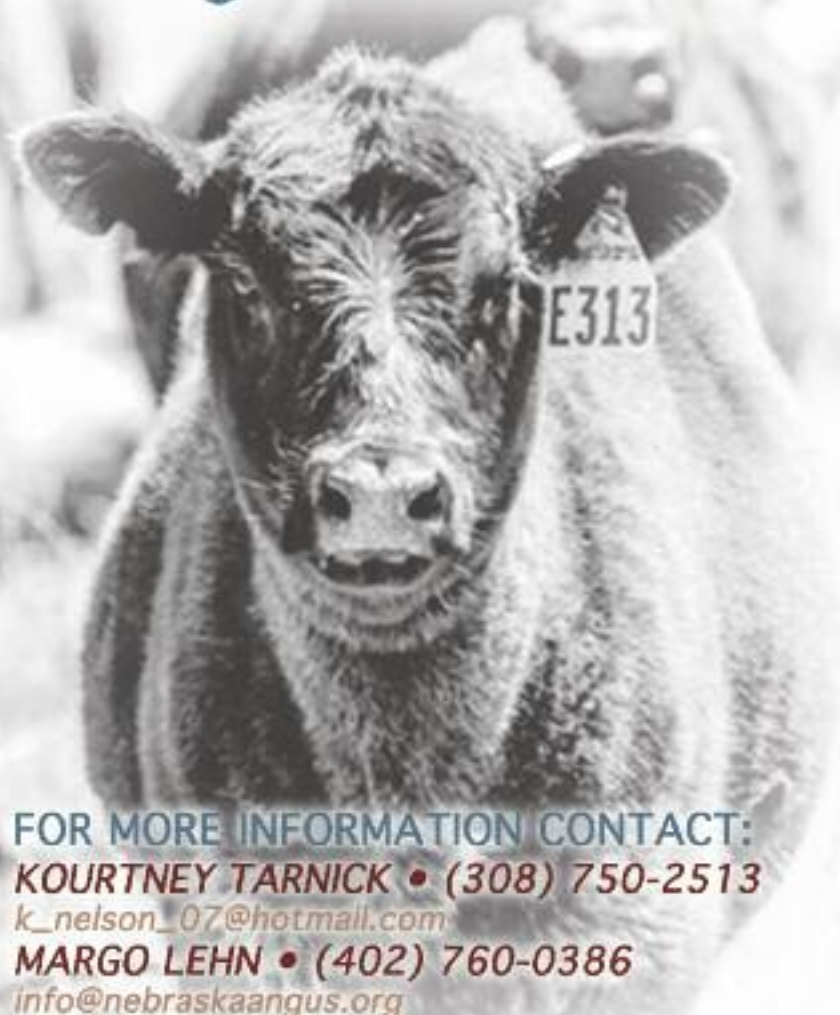

JOHN ANDERSON QUIRK

June 11, 1951 - April 11, 2021. He died at his home in Hastings, NE on April 11, 2021. John was born on June 11, 1951 in Hastings, and was the son of John P. and Helen (Anderson) Quirk. He attended Hastings Public Schools and graduated from Hastings High School in 1969. He then attended Harvard University in Cambridge, MA, where he graduated Magna cum Laude with a Degree in Economics in 1973.

After college, John returned to Hastings to serve as President of Quirk Land & Cattle Co., a position he held until his death. Quirk Land & Cattle Co. has operations in Nebraska, South Dakota, Texas, and Arkansas. He was also a founding member and served as the Executive Secretary of the Amerifax Cattle Association, which served to promote the Amerifax breed

(a cross between Angus and Beef Friesian).

He was an active member and officer of the board of directors of the Hastings Community Foundation and the Adams County Historical Society for more than 20 years, and was a founding member of the Ardyce Bohlke Torch Club. He also served on the Nebraska Rural Development Commission from 1991 to 2003 and was involved in numerous other statewide public service boards.

John was passionate about improving educational opportunities for others. He served on the school board for District 15 Elementary School from 1991 to 2007, and took great pride in integrating computers in the curriculum throughout the 1990s to keep the six-room school on the cutting edge of emerging technology. He also served on the Adams Central



Schools Foundation from 2001 until his death.

John became active in politics in High School and remained involved throughout his life. He was the Treasurer of the Adams County Democrats for 44 years. And politics is what brought John and Deb Hardin together. In 1976, John was volunteering for the presidential campaign of Jimmy Carter, and Deb was working on a local city council campaign. She contacted him for advice in running the campaign. Both of their candidates won in the fall--hers by 7 votes. John and Deb were engaged on July 7, 1977, and were married in December of that year. Beyond his professional pursuits and community service, John enjoyed working in the yard around his childhood home near Heartwell Park, where he returned to live the final year of his life.

John is survived by his wife, Deb Hardin Quirk of Hastings; son, Andrew Robert (Rob) Quirk of Brooklyn, NY; his sister and brother-in-law, Mary Quirk and James Anderson of Minneapolis, MN; sister-in-law, Su (Hardin) Ryden and her husband, Jerome Ryden of Aurora, CO; brother-in-law, Mike Hardin and his wife Margaret Hardin of Aurora, CO; and many nieces and nephews.

Services were held at 10:30 AM on Saturday, July 10, at First St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Hastings, with Pastor Joel Remmers officiating. Burial will be in Parkview Cemetery. DeWitt Funeral Home handled the arrangements.

Welcome to the Sellman Ranch. We take great pride in our cattle and enjoy what we do. We are located 25 miles South of Chadron which is known as the table area. Our area is known for our good dry land crops

and strong grass production. We are approximately 1000 feet higher in elevation than Chadron and on the South edge of the Pine Ridge.

Our family moved to Nebraska from Vegas, New Mexico in 1973 and have enjoyed the people, quality of life and livestock western Nebraska is known for. Family members are Butch & Gail, son Adam & Jodi and their children Jake and Bailey, son Ryan & Sandi and their children Kendall and Reid, and daughter Georganne & Brent and their children Wiley, Hannah and Kyle. We still work together but operate as separate operations raising families, cattle and enjoy farming and ranching.

We are in our 4th generation of registered cattle with Hereford cattle starting in the late 1950. The Sellman's hosted their first production sale in New Mexico in 1964. Thru the years we have raised and sold several notable bulls, shown carloads in Denver and our younger generation are very active in the junior program. Showing 14 National or Reserve Champions.

The Angus cow herd we have originated from the Vermilion Ranch in Montana over a period of 5 years starting in 1994. This spring we AI-ed 700 cows and heifers raising a wide variety of sires. We also flush a few cows each year. Herd bulls EXEC Mr Crossfire 6P01 (18538274), Sitz Logo 10429 (19381614) and our top selling bull from this spring sale SR Award 0203 (19836275) will be on display.

Our bull sales are held at Crawford Livestock Market the 2nd Friday of April each year. Selling 140 yearling and 2-year-old bulls with a nice private

treaty trade during the breeding season. Bred cows and heifers are sold each fall privately or thru Crawford Livestock Market fall cow sales.

The ranch also handles around 1500 of fresh weaned calves each fall. Calves are bought at Crawford Livestock Market from bull customers and local ranches. We feed the heavy calves at Bolek feed yard and go to grass with the lighter steers. They are summered and sold on Crawford Livestock Market Western Video sales in July. This area of Nebraska is known for some of the best summer gains on grass with reputation quality genetics.

We look forward to your visit during the tour and hope you enjoy this part of scenic Nebraska!

VIN-MAR CATTLE CO. Lunch Stop

Vin-Mar Cattle Co. is a family owned and operated ranch north of Clinton, Nebraska. It began in the winter of 2001 when our first registered Angus cows were purchased by Vince, Mary, Ryan and Bryson along with Mary's parents Jerry and Suzy Bottorff.

Jerry and Suzy Bottorff own Vin-Mar Cattle Co. which is part of our other family-owned operation, Bottorff Farms Inc. Not only have we raised registered Angus cattle, but also registered Herefords for the last 11 years. Along with the registered cattle we operate a commercial feedlot and yearling operation. I believe as a breeder it's very important to invest in some of our customers genetics. We made significant changes the past few years by having a complete dispersal of our spring calving herd and moving the cow herd to an all-fall calving approach. The switch was made for several reasons, but mostly to offer our customers a product that was

developed slower on grass so the bulls could cover more country and have more longevity in their future homes.

Over the years we have exhibited our cattle at the Black Hills Stock Show, and the National Western Stock Show with several champions and reserve champions. We thought it was very important to get our bulls out in

front of people from all over the country. By going to these events, we have made many lifelong friendships through exhibiting Angus cattle. Many of the people we still do business with today. Our annual production sale is at the ranch held on the 2nd Friday in February. At this sale we have been selling around 75 Angus and 25 Hereford bulls.

I was honored to serve as President of the Nebraska Angus Association and be on the board for several years. It was a great experience and I made several lifelong friends from serving. Glad to have everyone on the tour and I'm very excited for the future of the Angus breed.

Ashby – Just over 30 years ago, Clint Hebbert and his brother Pat, made the decision to raise cattle in a joint venture on some leased land near Ashby, NE, which is located on the western edge of the Nebraska Sandhills. Clint and Suzy were married in 1991, at that time they had 12 head of commercial cross-bred cows and bred heifers. Their sons Ed and Joe joined them in the operation 1993 and 1996, respectively.

The Hebberts added their first registered Angus cows in 1993 when they purchased three females on Vance and Connie Uden's mature cow sale. They returned to TC Ranch again in 1998 and selected five more cows. In

DOLEZAL ANGUS *Fourth Generation*

The Dolezal family includes Matt and his wife Kortney, their two sons Franklin (6), Randal (2) and daughter Hazel (8 months) and Matt's parents Dennis and Jill Dolezal. The Dolezal ranch is located six miles north of Rushville, Nebraska.

For the last 11 years this family has grown their operation to 60-70 head of registered cows and 40-50 commercial cows. Matt, who is a fourth-generation rancher started his registered herd in 2010 with the purchase of registered cows and heifers from Gary and Diane

operation. Currently bulls are sold private treaty in the spring, however Dolezal Angus has a long-term goal to have their own production sale after a solid maternal cow herd is established.

As President of the Nebraska Angus Association, Matt thanks all of our members for their support and hard work to keep this tour an event and hopes you will take the time to attend this year. the 90's, females were also added from Hoff Scotch Cap & Bon View Angus in South Dakota. Additional females were selected from the Russell Angus dispersal, Minert-Simonson Angus and Marcy Cattle Co. in Nebraska. These registered cows served as the foundation of their herd. Over the next sixteen years, they kept only their top performing heifers as replacements and grew their herd to current numbers of 135 cows and bred heifers. In 2017 & 2019 they once again added genetics on the female side with the purchase of females from Baldrige Tiedeman Angus.

Along the way, they purchased bulls from the top end of Nebraska producer's sales such as Minert-

Simonson Ranch, Vin-Mar Cattle Co, Kraye Angus and A & B Cattle. They frequently collect semen on their herd sires and A.I. to their herd bulls as often as they select semen from sires in bull stud lineups. They have also utilized Embryo Transfer in their operation, selecting some of their top producing females to flush, it is on a small-scale basis. They will be adding their first "outside herd" embryos to their program in the next few months.

Their goal is to produce broody, thick, deep ribbed females with lots of volume. Their operation is a spring calving herd, and they try to run about 75% of the cows and every heifer through the A.I. chute. This year they utilized the new 7 & 7 synch program on the cows and were really pleased to see how well the cows responded to that protocol. The older cows and later calving cows were turned out with a bull for natural service this year on the 10th of May.

The calf crop is not creep fed, they want the calf weaning weights to be a true reflection of the calves' own genetic potential, their dam's milking ability and what Mother Nature provides in the Sandhills forage. Steer calves are usually marketed in October and replacement heifers are sorted in the fall. Bulls are monitored on a feed test at the ranch, while heifers are grown on 2-3 lbs. of protein supplement/head/day. Heifer numbers are sorted again in January and later born heifers are sold then as replacements at sale barn auction.

The cattle are run on 2,400 leased and owned acres. There is 250 acres of native grass meadows that serves as their winter feed source and the balance of the acres is pasture. They purchase supplemental protein for winter feeding of the cowherd.

In the early years, E D Angus bulls were marketed by private treaty. Then a bid-off procedure was added to the private treaty bull sale. In 2015, the sale became a production sale where bulls and

replacement heifers were offered in a live auction. The sale is now annually held on the third Sunday in March. They held their 21st sale this year.

Throughout the years, E D Angus was basically a four-person operation. Clint and Suzy's sons Ed and Joe played an integral part in the workload. As they left home, went to school, and entered the workforce in their chosen fields, it is now basically back to a "Mom and Pop" management style. Ed and his wife Kate live in Clay Center, NE where he is employed with NRCS at the Geneva office. Joe and his wife Makala live at Stuart, NE, and farm with her family. Each couple periodically make it home to help with major events such as the sale or spring branding.

This year, to make their operation safer and more efficient, they invested in an Arrowquip tub/alley/chute/head catch system. It was a significant expenditure but has decreased the amount of time it takes to work a group of cattle and ensures physical safety for both Clint and Suzy and their cattle. They do not plan on expanding their cattle numbers much, preferring to concentrate on quality, keeping in mind... "If you raise top-quality cows, exceptional bulls and heifers will be born to those cows, and your herd improves with each new calf crop". They are looking forward to visiting with tour goers at the noon meal stop where their cattle will be on display.

Conroy Angus is a family owned operation by Maynard & wife, Debra with son, Rhett who is a vet tech at Sasse Animal Clinic in Gordon. Our oldest son, Lane lives in Casper, Wyoming as does newlywed son, Chris and his wife Brooke.

Maynard worked 24 years at instilling ag related studies to students at Gordon and Rushville High Schools as well as sponsoring FFA where his students excelled at welding and other contests. During those years, Deb was homemaking as well as daytime cattle care specialist. Both now wonder how Maynard had time for the teaching career as the ranch is a full time job.

The first 11 cows were purchased in 1985 from the Raymond Andrews dispersal. Additional cows were added from Rager, Sandage, Krebs and 76 Ranch. We had not added any cows for over 20 years and Rhett purchased 11 head in 2016. In addition we added a few fall calvers from Vermilion. In 2012 we exported bred heifers to Kazakhstan.

We currently run 135 registered cows. About 80 % of the cows and heifers are AIed. Sires represented on the tour are Growth Fund, Treasure, Spur, Trapper, MVP, Beast Mode and Payweight Plus. We generally sell 35-40 yearling registered bulls to buyers (often repeat) in a 50 mile radius around Gordon.

Our bulls and heifers bucket fed and we use no creep feed.

Our 30th annual bull sale will be held on March 8, 2022 at Gordon Livestock. Heifers are sold private treaty or through the sale barn.

Our goal is to raise Quality Angus Cattle. Thanks for coming on the Nebraska Angus Tour.

The Junior Angus Herdsman award is awarded to one National Junior Angus Association (NJAA) member who displays a strong work ethic, dedication to his/her animals and has the skill to prepare their cattle for exhibition. This year the 2021 National Junior Angus Show (NJAS) Junior Herdsman of the Year was awarded to Miranda Raithel of Falls City, Nebraska.

In 1998 Raithel's father was awarded the Angus Herdsman award at the National Western Stock Show. Now in 2021, it was only fitting that his daughter follows in his footsteps. Miranda Raithel was born on January 13, 2000, and by January 21, 2001, she had already been issued her official National Junior Angus membership.

Growing up, Raithel could be found in the show barn alongside her parents at Herbster Angus Farm. From nutrition to management, Raithel says she understands cattle from being mentored by her parents, Ed and Mandy, and Cash Langford.

"I'm actually really glad to be recognized in my home state during my last year," said Raithel. "Call it the stars aligning, but it's pretty neat to win the herdsman's buckle in your home state."

To be selected to receive the Herdsman Award, juniors must be in their last year of junior eligibility and are voted on by ballot by NJAA members exhibiting at the National Junior Angus Show. Junior members are asked to evaluate their peers throughout the week and turn their official ballot in to the show office by noon on Friday of the National Junior Angus Show.

Raithel said she has learned everything she knows from her dad, and together they make quite the father-daughter duo.

Jace Stagemeyer becomes the grandest showman

Jace Stagemeyer wins top honors at the 2021 NJAS prestigious showmanship contest.

Members of the National Junior Angus Association (NJAA) all aspire to have the chance to compete for the Champion Showman title at the National Junior Angus Show (NJAS). Jace Stagemeyer of Nebraska had his dream come true as he was named the 2021 NJAS showmanship winner in Grand Island, Nebraska on July 17, 2021.

"I said to myself you're either going big or going home, then they announced my name and all my nerves just went away," Stagemeyer said. "Deep down inside I was thrilled. I knew I had the potential to do it, but it comes down to so many little nitty gritty things that are out of my control. I was super thrilled."

Although many junior national shows have a showmanship contest, there are a few factors that come into play that potentially make this the most prestigious showmanship contest of them all. First, to have the opportunity to compete at the NJAS showmanship competition, juniors must be se-

lected by their home state. The juniors that are selected have only one year of eligibility. At NJAS, juniors must compete in preliminary rounds with hopes of being selected as the top 15 showman and women.

The top 5 winners were selected by judges Cody Bock of Illinois; Britney Creamer of Colorado; Susan Henderson-Perry of California; and Bobby Strecker of Colorado. The top 5 winners are awarded each a coveted Silver Revere bowl sponsored by the American Angus Auxiliary. As a part of being selected as the champion showman, the junior member is awarded the Dean Hurlbut Award in honor of the man who began the Angus showmanship competition in 1967.

"It was a really humbling experience and I feel really blessed to have even had the opportunity to experience it," Stagemeyer said. "This is probably the premiere showmanship competition in the nation, and to be able to make it to that top spot was a once in a lifetime opportunity – that makes it even more special."

Showmanship exhibitors were evaluated on how they handle their animal, sportsmanship, plus their ability to follow instructions given by the judges. To enhance the contest further, exhibitors were given preselected heifers and switched animals with other exhibitors several times throughout the contest to prove their skills. The rest of the top 5 winners included: second place, Natalie Philips of West Virginia; third place, Chancee Clark of Oklahoma; fourth place, Hannah Tremaine of Wisconsin; and fifth place, Eva Hinrichsen of Kansas.

The National Junior Showmanship displays the best of the best in terms of livestock handling. The remaining top 15 contestant were: Brooklyn Curtin of Iowa, Kaitlyn Bell of Pennsylvania, Zachary McCall of Virginia, Whitney Walker of Arkansas, Maguire Rohr of Colorado, Erica Chapman of Iowa, Ashlyn Mool of Illinois, Alexandria Czoritto of Kansas, Kyle Wimmer of Kansas and Claire Brown of Indiana.

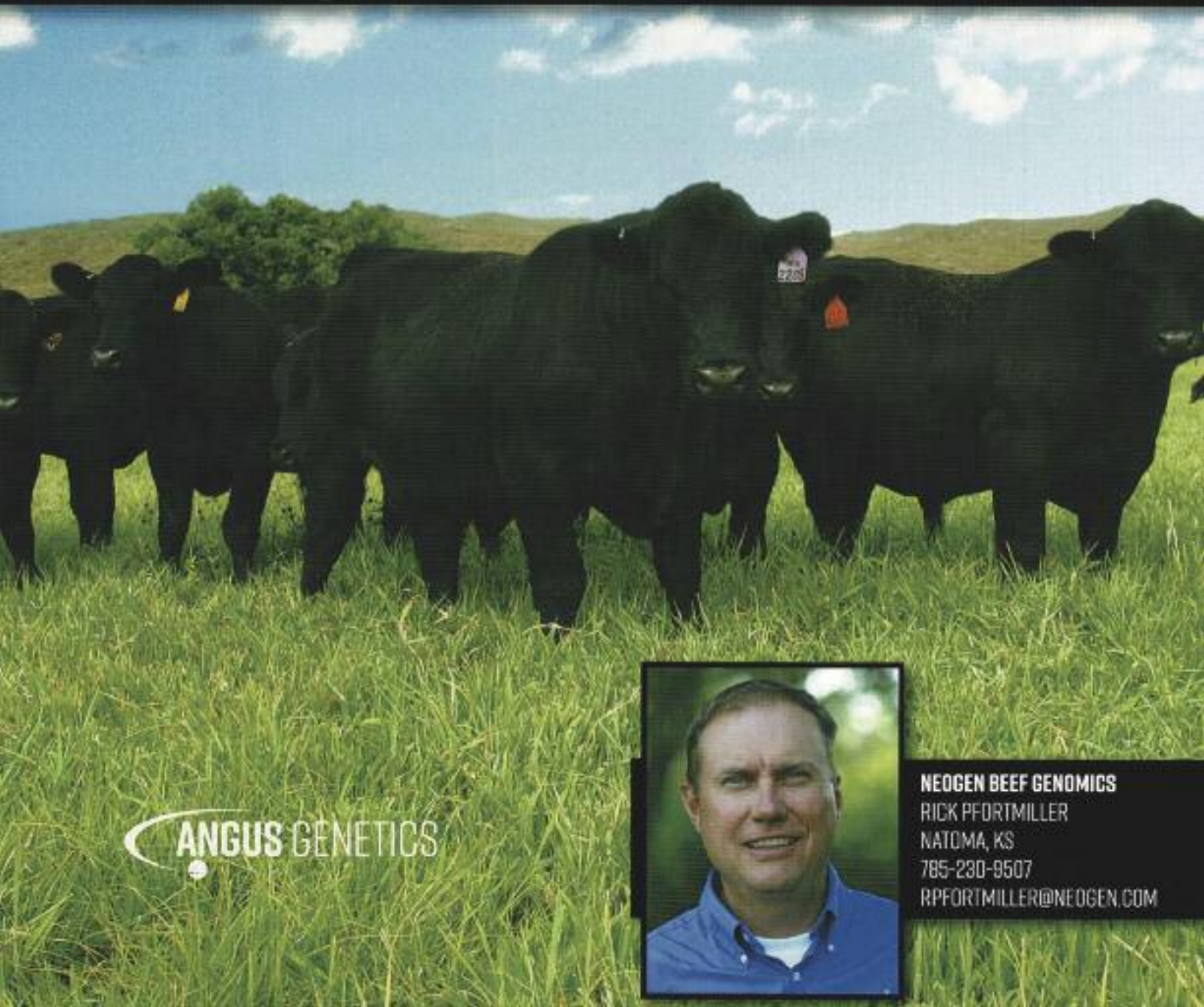

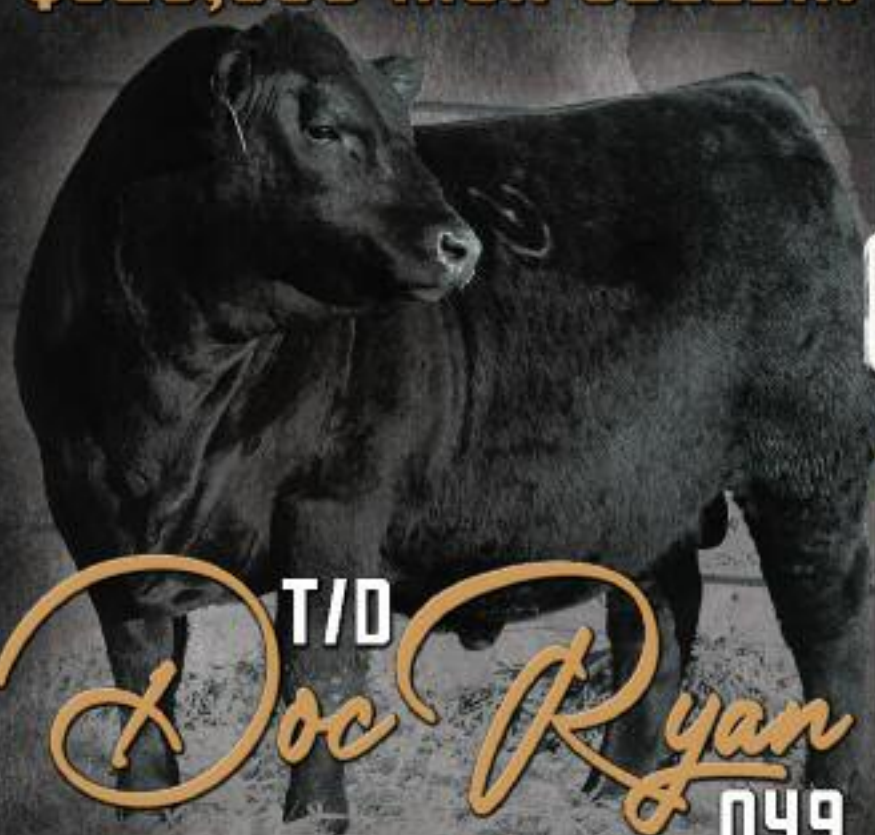

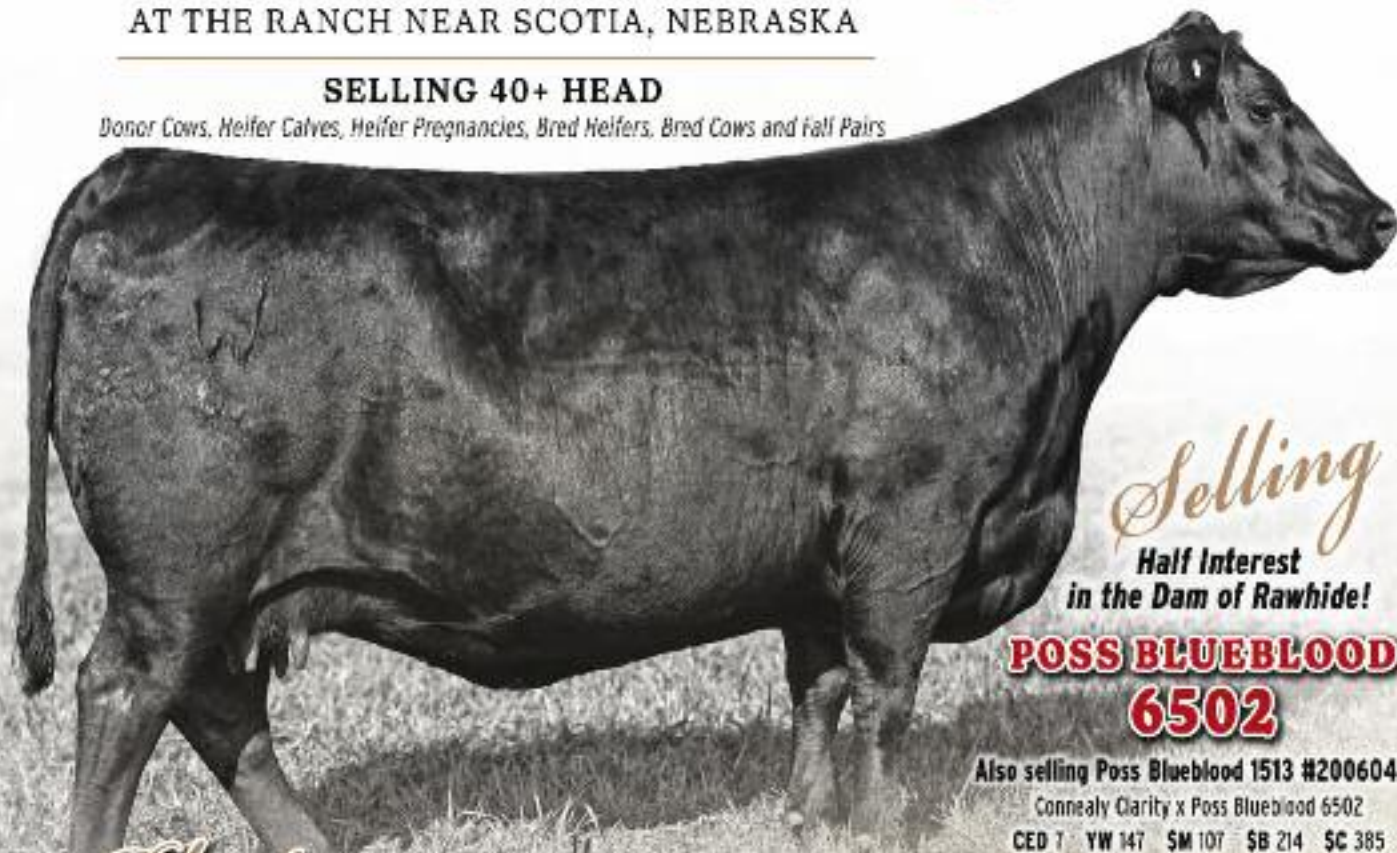
