





Dear Nebraska Angus Friends,

ere's looking to hope on the horizon for a good 2021 for us all!

There is a new program that has been instituted as part of the long-standing AHIR program. It is called Inventory Reporting. It was unveiled at the November Annual Meeting for those who were there in person or who viewed online.

Inventory Reporting may be a change in mindset for folks regarding traditional reporting methods. Rather than submitting data on individual calves, producers are called upon to identify and report their active cowherd and then submit data based on that cowherd and its progeny.

The primary goal of Inventory Based Reporting is to assist AHIR in capturing even more data for our breed to continue to improve the accuracy of our EPDs, \$ Values, and Genetic Merit Scores. The secondary benefit to producers is that they will have an even better handle on their cowherd – its numbers and production.

Here is an overview of Inventory Reporting Benefits:

- 1) It is easy to participate
- 2) It captures "hard to reach" traits for the Association
- All cows are accounted for, not just those who produced offspring
- 4) There are a significant number of disposal codes/reasons designations for producers to use
- 5) Comprehensive meaningful data = unbiased data results
- 6) The data will help to characterize maternal traits health, fertility, and longevity



The staff at AAA has spent an enormous amount of time building a webbased platform for producers to use for enrollment that makes the initial herd sign-up as easy as possible.

A webinar by Jerry Cassady and Chris Stallo at the Association office was broadcast on December 1st that outlined the program in greater depth and provides a walk-through of the online enrollment platform. I highly recommend watching this webinar for a better idea of what is entailed. It can be found through a YouTube search for Angus TV, and the episode title is "Investing in Inventory."


For those of you who are already enrolled in Maternal Plus, this Inventory Reporting program does not replace that. Maternal Plus is simply the highest level of herd-based reporting, and this new Inventory Reporting program can be viewed as a stepping stone to that higher designation, if so desired.







NEBRASKA PRODUCER OF THE YEAR

D ANGUS - OPERATION STRIVES FOR EXCELLENCE

Ashby –This year's Producer of the Year, had small beginnings. Just over 30 years ago, Clint Hebbert and his brother Pat, made the decision to raise cattle in a joint venture on some leased land near Ashby, NE, which is located on the western edge of the Nebraska Sandhills. Clint and Suzy were married in 1991, at that time they had 12 head of commercial cross-bred cows and bred heifers. Their sons Ed and Joe joined them in the operation 1993 and 1996, respectively.

The Hebberts added their first registered Angus cows in 1993 when they purchased three females on Vance and Connie Uden's mature cow sale. They returned to TC Ranch again in 1998 and selected five more cows. In the 90's, females were also added from Hoff Scotch Cap & Bon View Angus in South Dakota. Additional females were selected from the Russell Angus dispersal, Minert-Simonson Angus and Marcy Cattle Co. in Nebraska. These registered cows served as the foundation of their herd. Over the next sixteen years, they kept only their top performing heifers as replacements and grew their herd to current numbers of 115 cows and bred heifers. In 2017 & 2019 they once again added genetics on the female side with the purchase of females from Baldridge Tiedeman Angus.

Along the way, they purchased bulls from the top end of Nebraska producer's sales such as Minert-Simonson Ranch, Vin-Mar Cattle Co, Kraye Angus and A & B Cattle. They frequently collect semen on their herd sires and A.I. to their herd bulls as often as they select semen from sires in bull stud lineups. They have also utilized Embryo Transfer in their operation, selecting some of their top producing females to flush, it is on a small scale basis, but this task has been scaled back this last year due to limited time available to successfully manage it.

Their goal is to produce broody, thick, deep ribbed females with lots of volume. Their operation is a spring calving herd, and they try to run every cow and heifer through the A.I. chute, beginning the first week in May and finish that A.I. program by June 1st if possible. Heifers are synchronized while cows are A.I.'d on natural heat the first 10 days of the breeding season and then synchronized in two groups.

The calf crop is not creep fed, they want the calf weaning weights to be a true reflection of the calves' own genetic potential, their dam's milking ability and what Mother Nature provides in the Sandhills forage. Steer calves are usually marketed in October and replacement heifers are sorted in the fall. Bulls are monitored on a feed test at the ranch, while heifers are grown on 2-3 lbs. of protein supplement/head/day. Heifer numbers are sorted again in January and later born heifers are sold then as replacements at sale barn auction.

In the early years, E D Angus bulls were marketed by private treaty. Then a bid-off procedure was added to the private treaty bull sale. In 2015, the sale became a production sale where bulls and replacement heifers were offered in a live auction. The sale is now annually held on the third Sunday in March. They celebrated their 20th sale this year.

The Hebberts have benefited from membership and involvement in the Nebraska Angus Association. They exhibited a pair of bred heifers in the 2005 Pen show, winning reserve champion pen but more significantly that pair of heifers topped the sale that day. They have participated in the annual tour, exhibited cattle at Husker Harvest Days and they try to attend the year end banquet annually. Suzy served two terms on the Association board as the West district director. Essentially, they feel the networking and contacts with members across the state,

both at the Nebraska annual meeting and the National Angus Convention, have provided a base from which to fine tune and improve their own program.

Throughout the years, E D Angus was basically a four-person operation. Clint and Suzy's sons Ed and Joe played an integral part in the workload. As they left home, went to school, and entered the workforce in their chosen fields, it is now basically back to a "Mom and Pop" management style.

Ed and his wife Kate live in Clay
Center, NE where he is employed with
UNL Forages department at the Meat
Animal Research Center. Kate's
immigration process from Canada is nearly
finished and she is seeking local
employment. Joe and his wife Makala live
at Stuart, NE, and farm with her family.
Makala is employed as a Community
Development Specialist with the Central
Nebraska Economic Development District.
The boys and their wives periodically
make it home to help with major events
such as the sale or spring branding.

Clint and Suzy don't plan on expanding their cattle numbers much, preferring to concentrate on quality, keeping in mind... "If you raise top-quality cows, exceptional bulls and heifers will be born."



OUR ANGUS FAMILY OBITUARY

AX HOFFMEISTER
Max was into life full time
and for the long run. He was
born on September 29, 1927 to Isabel
(Bennison) and Max Hoffmeister at
Imperial, Nebraska, the oldest of three,
growing up with sisters Mary
(Hillberry) and Ruth (Piva). He
attended grade and high school in
Imperial, graduating from Chase
County High School in 1946. while in
high school, he was active in many
school activities as well as football and
basketball



He joined the service in 1946, taking basic training at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri. He served in the U.S. Army Ordinance Corps, rising to the rank of Tech Fourth Class (E4) in 2 years. He was a soldier in the American Occupational Forces in Japan. The boat that he was on to take home from San Francisco to Japan had to turn back before they left the harbor because it was taking on water, twice. While underway, he noticed there were very few lifeboats for a lot of people. He never cared to go out on the water after that. His troop transport ship docked at Honolulu Harbor, but he did not get to go ashore other than standing guard at the gangplank. His boat stopped at Okinawa and the soldiers on board had to march around the island. It kept them out of mischief. While marching, he saw no standing tree or structure that was not destroyed. Upon arriving in occupied Japan, he was transported through Hiroshima, which he described as a wasteland, and looked just like the films. He served at Nagasaki, the second bomb site. While in Japan he was in a motor pool, often handling the paperwork. Whoever needed to check out a vehicle usually was judged by need by what was on their shoulder or the top or on the side. He once helped unload a supply boat in Incheon Harbor. He

never understood how America landed there in the night in the Korean War a few years later. In the service he acquired a lot of mechanical training. His trust in mechanical war was gauged by this often said phrase expect a 50% failure rate at the point of attack." He never complained about taxes after serving, seeing how taxes helped improve bad situations. He hated the devastation that was visited upon the country of Japan, experiencing great empathy for their people. One of the stories he told his children was that he could get his boots polished for the metal pop bottle caps, and that the Japanese people worked hard for very little. After serving, he was active in the Veterans of Foreign Wars and the American

Max became engaged to Gladys Bussell at the Western Stock Show in Denver, Colorado on his way home from Japan. they married August 17, 1948 at the Methodist Church in Imperial, Nebraska.

Max managed the family registered purebred Angus herd, one of the oldest herds in Nebraska, lasting over 97 consecutive years, first founded by his grandfather, Dr. Fred Hoffmeister. He and his father showed cattle many years at the Western Stock Show and took state champion bull at Ak-Sar-Ben. He was instrumental in creating the Southwestern Nebraska Angus Association, which helped the smaller ranchers to have a way to sell their animals. He was that association's president and sales manager for more than 25 years. He also was sales manager for several other Registered Angus Association sanctioned sales. Max passed away on Friday afternoon, November 13, 2020 at the Wauneta Care and therapy Center in Wauneta, Nebraska. He was 93 years of age.

Max was predeceased by his parents, Max and Isabel (Bennison) Hoffmeister; and his father and mother-in-law, Henry Milton & Lorena (Harmon) Bussell; his sisters and brothers-in-law, Mary (Hoffmeister) and Al Hillberry and Ruth (Hoffmeister and Louis Piva; his brothers-in-law and wife, by marriage to Gladys, Calvin Bussell and Olan & Lois (Beard) Bussell.

Max is survived by Gladys (Bussell) Hoffmeister, his wife of 72 years; his daughters Bonita Hoffmeister of Atlanta, Georgia and LaDene Culver and her husband, Ron, of Laramie, Wyoming; his sons, Frederick (Fred) Hoffmeister and his significant other Mary Ann Eaglin of Imperial, Nebraska and Andrew (Andy) Hoffmeister and his wife nancy Freburg of Kearney, Nebraska. He is also survived by eight granddaughters and eight greatgrandchildren.

In all respects, he was a good man, a loving husband, and a great father.

No visitation will be scheduled. Max's wishes were for cremation.

Services are pending at this time and Liewer Funeral Homes are in charge of the arrangements.





ive new directors were elected to the 2020-2021 American Angus Association® board of directors, as well as a president and chairman, and a vice president and treasurer of the board, during the 137th Annual Convention of Delegates hosted in Kansas City, Missouri.

Delegates voted to represent Association members at the 137th Annual Meeting and elected the 2020-2021 officers and directors. Directors can serve up to two three-year terms on the board and, if elected, serve additional one-year terms in office as president and chairman and/or vice president and treasurer.

Elected to their first terms are Mark Ahearn, Texas; Smitty Lamb, Georgia; Charles Mogck, South Dakota; Darrell Stevenson, Montana; and Jerry Theis, Kansas.

Board Members Elected

Mark Ahearn and his family established Turner Meadow Ranch in East Texas in the mid-1980s. Apart from his 35year career in law enforcement, Ahearn's passion has always lied in raising high-quality Angus cattle. He has studied pedigrees and learned the business from the ground up. His family has grown their herd to about 200 females while being active in the Texas Angus Association. Ahearn served in a leadership role with the Texas Angus Association for 16 years. In addition to creating numerous educational opportunities and sale events, Ahearn was also responsible for creating and writing the policy for the Raymond Moore Endowment Scholarship Fund which benefits Texas Junior Angus members.

Smitty Lamb grew up on a small row crop farm in East Georgia where he discovered his passion for Angus cattle at an early age. He followed that drive to the University of Georgia (UGA) where he earned a bachelor's degree in animal science and a master's degree in meat and muscle biology. His career eventually led him to an opportunity in the cotton industry, but he always came home to Angus cattle. His family has owned and operated Ogeechee Angus Farm since 1997, and it has since become one of the most reliable sources for Angus genetics in the Southeast. Since 2017, Ogeechee Angus Farm has marketed more than 100 bulls annually. Lamb has served in leadership roles with the Georgia Angus Association, as well as the chairman of the Southern National Angus Show committee and the

co-committee chair of the 2009 National Junior Angus Show. The Lambs were awarded the Georgia Angus Association Member of the Year in 2017 for their service to the organization.

Charles Mogck is a third-generation Angus breeder from South Dakota. Mogck has built upon his family's heritage in the breed and increased their herd to 400 registered females while marketing 120 bulls annually. They farm 2,000 acres of corn, beans and wheat with an additional 2,500 acres of pasture and hay ground. Mogck & Sons routinely buys feeder cattle from their commercial customers, which allows them to collect data on their customers cattle. Their operation actively utilizes Association programs such as MaternalPlusTM and Angus Herd Improvement RecordsSM (AHIR). Mogck records ultrasound, carcass and genomic information to make the best decisions for the future of their herd.

Darrell Stevenson has strong ties to the Angus breed and a history of activity in the Montana Angus Association. Stevenson's grandparents were charter members of the Montana Angus Association in 1951, and his father participated in the first National Junior Angus Showmanship contest in 1967. His father was on the Montana Angus Association and American Angus Association board of directors as well, serving as president from 1992-1993. Stevenson now continues his family's legacy by operating Stevenson Angus Ranch. He is actively involved in international Angus events and has attended shows in Argentina, New Zealand, Scotland and Russia. In 2010 Stevenson created a partnership with two Russian businessmen to form an international beef venture between the two countries. Due to the success, Stevenson has since overseen shipments of Angus cattle to Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan and Uzbekistan.

Jerry Theis is a devoted secondgeneration Angus breeder and lifetime member of the American Angus Association. His parents established April Valley Farms in 1952 in the Salt Creek Valley area of Leavenworth County, Kansas. Theis continues his family's diversified operation, now consisting of Angus cattle, crop and swine production. Cattle are marketed through their annual spring production sale as well as private treaty. April Valley Farms was recognized as a Historic Angus Herd by the American Angus Association in 2019. Jerry graduated from the Kansas State University College of Veterinary Medicine in 1991 and currently operates a mixed-animal veterinary practice. He and his wife are actively involved in the Kansas Angus Association and currently serve as the Kansas Junior Angus Association advisors. He served two terms on the Kansas Angus Association board of directors and as president in 2010.

Officers Elected

David Dal Porto, Oakley, California, was elected as Association president and chairman of the board. Dal Porto succeeds Don Schiefelbein, Kimball, Minnesota, who served as president from 2019-2020. Dal Porto and his wife, Jeanene, manage their registered and commercial Angus operation in Oakley, Brentwood and northern California. They have three children - Lindsey, AJ and Dawson. Dal Porto has firsthand experience at every level in the evolution of performance information and how to apply it. He complements that knowledge with a management background developed from his experiences. Dal Porto and his bull sale partner, David Medeiros, were awarded the 2011 Certified Angus Beef® (CAB) Seedstock Commitment to Excellence Award at the CAB Annual Conference.

Jerry Connealy, Whitman, Nebraska, was elected by delegates to serve as Association vice president and vice chairman. He has served on the Association board of directors for six years and spent this last year as Association treasurer. The fifth-generation cattleman has operated the family ranch since 1981 with his wife, Sharon. The Connealys have three sons, Jed, Gabriel and Ben; as well as a daughter, Hannah. Jerry focuses his cow herd base on productivity traits and manages two bull sales per year, selling 300 bulls at each sale.

Chuck Grove, Forest, Virginia, who is currently serving his second term on the board of directors, will serve as the 2020-2021 Association treasurer. Grove was an American Angus Association regional manager serving Kentucky and Tennessee, and during his 39-year tenure, he also covered Virginia, Maryland, West Virginia, Delaware and Ohio. Grove and his wife, Ruth, reside on the family farm and run a 100-head Angus herd.
