Summer has been in full swing and the Association is looking forward to fall. August and September are busy months here at the Nebraska Angus Association office and I want to inform you of the events coming up.

First event will be the Lowell Minert Open Angus Show at the Nebraska State Fair in Grand Island. Open



class beef cattle may start arriving on Monday, August 29th at 10:00 AM and must be in place by Tuesday, August 30th at 10:00 AM. Levi Landers and myself will do a walk around check in, so you do not have to bring your animals up front. Please go to the office for exhibitor numbers and information. Juniors, please note that breeding heifers need to be checked in at the State Fair office. The show will begin at 9:00 AM on the 31st. Angus are in Ring 1 and will follow Red Angus. The judge for the show will be Jon DeClerck. Junior Breeding Heifers will follow at 4:00 PM and Supreme Row will be September 1st at 6:00 PM. A \$12,000 added money award will be available for Supreme Champions. The Nebraska Angus Association each year awards \$500 each to the top Nebraska Bred and Owned Bull and Female. Please join us this year at the State Fair!

Following the State Fair, the Association will travel to display at Husker Harvest Days. Dates for the event are September 13-15th. We will have a great display of Angus cattle and information. You can sign up to be on the Nebraska Angus Tour, buy a Heifer Raffle ticket, visit with our Nebraska Angus Association members, and see elite Angus genetics. Come show your support for the Angus breed and beef education this year at Husker Harvest Days!

Next, we will gear up for the annual Nebraska Angus Tour on September 26th and 27th! This year the tour will be held in the Northeastern District. Headquarters for the tour will be Norfolk at Norfolk Lodge and Suites or known as Divots. There is a huge lineup this year for the tour! First, the tour will kick off Monday morning with registration at 8:00 AM at Divots. From there the tour participants are given the option of golf at Crofton Lakeside Golf Course or a river tour along the Missouri River and Gavin's Point. Bus transportation is available upon request by September 1st! In the afternoon we will travel to the Lewis and Clark Pulley Museum for a tour and lunch, stop at Heine Farms Feedyard located near Crofton, and then travel west of Crofton for our first cattle display at Poppe Bulls. Following Poppe Bulls, the tour will move to Foxhoven Angus for the evening dinner stop. Dinner stop will include a Foxhoven Angus cattle display, great food, and special guest Tyler Walsh for an evening full of laughter and fun! For Tuesday, the tour will be an all-day event starting with a breakfast and cattle display at Jindra Angus near Clarkson. From there we will move to Columbus, Nebraska, to Ag Park to see displays from Frese Angus and Macholan Angus. At Ag Park there will be a brief presentation by Jerry Cassady of American Angus Association Member Services and tour sponsor Big Iron. For lunch we will move to the Bullodge in Fullerton where they will offer several Angus cattle on display, and an equipment demonstration. Those displays include: Frenzen Angus, DBL Inc, Dodds Cattle Co, Dubas Cattle Co, Dubas Equipment, Sonderup Angus, and T&E Angus. From Fullerton, the tour will move to Wagonhammer Ranches near Albion, this year's heifer raffle donator, for a ranch stop, and conclude at Niewohner Arena for dinner and cattle displays from Circle B Livestock LLC and Scott Angus Cattle. Registration for the tour is due to the office by September 15th at \$50 per person (September 1st if you want to ride the bus)! There

is also a discounted hotel room block set at Divots. Please ask for the Nebraska Angus Tour and have reservations made by August 26th to receive a discount. Please join us this year for all the fun at the Nebraska Angus Tour!

Fellow Cattlemen,

Thope as you read this you have been blessed with big, healthy Angus calves on green grass. As I write this in mid-July in our area of Southwest Nebraska, we have received around 6 inches or less of moisture in the last 13 months. Along with day after day of 100-degree temperatures, the grass is getting really short and feed supplies are tight and almost nonexistent in some areas.

On a recent trip into the Sandhills, it was good to see green grass as some areas have been blessed with timely rains. So, as it is every year some areas are better off than others.

In southwest Nebraska, tough decisions are looming for area producers. Herd liquidations have been ongoing all spring and summer. Many producers are selling the calf crop or weaning 2-3 months earlier than normal.

The good news is the calf price at the sale barns and summer videos seem to be substantially higher than last year.



Nebraska Angus genetics are some of the best and most sought after in the world. Recent sales have had prices approaching \$2.25 for 600lb calves, \$2.00 for 900lb steers and over \$1.50 for fat cattle. Nebraska Angus producers are producing the best beef products in the world, and you should be applauded for it!

In Association news we are gearing up for the Nebraska State Fair, Husker Harvest Days, and the Nebraska Angus Tour. This year the tour will be held in the northeastern part of the state on September 26-27th. The Nebraska Angus Tour is a great event with a lot of great food, comradery, and Angus cattle. Hope to see you there!



Dear Nebraska Angus Friends,

The big news in our industry is that the Certified Angus Beef brand has exceeded 1.2 billion pounds in sales for fiscal 2021! What an accomplishment, and what a nice spark of optimism for today's cattle market.

This kind of sales success gives us assurance that the consumers are desiring (and paying for) a superior product in both restaurants and retail outlets. The CAB acceptance rate of black cattle is sitting at 37%.

Of note, so far in 2022, CAB prime carcasses are bringing \$20 per hundredweight over choice CAB carcasses.





Karen's Dad, Ken Kube of 10 Bar Ranch in 1980. A few years later Angus cows were acquired from Kube 10 Bar Ranch and Bryce Angus Ranch from Plainview. The herd grew slowly in the early years being a part of a diversified operation that included a farrow to finish hog operation.

Gary's interest in improving beef genetics began in 1972 as a sophomore in high school, encouraged by a local Carnation breeding service representative to take an instructional class to learn the practice of artificial insemination. This skill and quality foundation Angus cows began the journey that led the herd to where it is today. The second generation began in 2005 when Jay, Deanna and their kids came back home and the opportunity to grow the herd arose.

Today, the hogs are gone and a larger herd of Angus, SimAngus and Red Angus cows remain. Their Angus females are the result of a quality foundation, enhanced by many years of artificial insemination. Their goal is to get as many females A.I. bred as possible with well over 300 cows and NE during the Nebraska Angus Tour. Hope to see soon!

OXHOVEN ANGUS Working For What They Love

Foxhoven Angus of Crofton, Nebraska, will serve as our evening meal stop on day one of the tour. Foxhoven's started their Angus operation in the early 90's with around 12 heifers and over the years have grown to 470 registered Angus females. They have not purchased any outside families since the start.

Their breeding program focuses on performance and fertility ability. The cattle are deep, stout, long and muscular. Replacement heifers and bulls are selected off of structure, feet, legs and performance at weaning time. Foxhoven's utilize in herd genetics

and with that around 70% of the females are bred to bulls they have raised or purchased, and when the fresh genetics of the top sons of the new genetics click, they collect and use that in the herd. Foxhoven's cows are very productive and they are at the top of the state for pathfinder awards. They focus on making every cow great. They breed on natural heats for the first cycle and get high conception rates.

The operation is run by family alone, along with great friends during their bull sale. Galen takes care of everyday feeding and farming. Galen and "Brenda", who recently passed away, live on the original family homestead. He is the third generation on this land. Brock and Jody, along with their kids (Tuff, Ellie and Maci), live on the calving headquarters. They take care of the calving, breeding, and everyday cattle work. Justin and Erin, along with their kids (Ian and Layla), live on the sale place and help out wherever needed. Justin owns a construction company in Crofton that builds everything from cabins, homes and sheds.

Brock has served as President of the Nebraska Angus Association. He currently is active on the Knox County Cattlemen's Board. He stays active in everything cattle related. INDRA ANGUS Breeding for Efficiency In 1878 Jozef and Josefka Jindra traveled from Hlinsko, Czech

Republic to settle near what is now Clarkson, Nebraska where they started farming and raising cattle. The Jindra family has been involved in agriculture in that area ever since. Growing up, Nick enjoyed going to cattle sales with his father Roger and

grandpa Edwin. Nick's registered Angus herd began as a 4-H and FFA project when he was able to start working with cattle and has grown ever since.

In the 1990's high quality feeder cattle that were able to convert with the most profit potential for the Jindra's were found far from home. The Hoff Scotch Cap herd of Bison, SD is where the first foundation registered females were purchased in 1994. From that time on until the Hoff's dispersed in 2006, the Jindra cow herd grew from Hoff genetics extensively with artificial insemination, embryo transfer, and the addition of top

The Hereford side of the operation is smaller and still being established. Females have been purchased from Linton Polled Herefords, Sandhill Farms, and Vin-Mar Cattle. From 2009-2013 small numbers of bulls were sold privately. Sales and interest increased from 2014-2016, then in 2017 the decision was made to switch to an annual spring bull sale. 

Then, they started to buy registered Angus from several top Angus breeders. By 2006, they were selling commercial and registered bulls, and commercial Angus females on a yearly sale. In the last couple of years, they have started a very aggressive embryo program using some of their younger donor cows and herd bulls. In 2022, they placed close to 200 embryos into their top commercial recipient cows. Their base cow herd goes back to SAV, but they have branched into many other top Angus programs. They have bought top herd sire bulls such as, Mohnen Worldwide 2617, Monhen Homeraised, Baldridge Versatile, and Ellingson Turn Key. Many of this year's replacement heifers kept are out of SAV Black Diamond, Renovation,

America, Circuit Breaker, Mohnen Niobrara, and Worldwide.

Along with raising Angus cattle Dean and Bonnie own and operate two feedlots. These feedlots are Christensen Cattle at Central City and Sandy Ridge at

Fullerton. The feeding capacity between the two feedlots is 25,000 head. The family farm and run a trucking company as well.

Their short-term and long-term goals are to produce highly productive animals for their customers and their operation that will show profit at the end of the day. They hope to keep and replace annually with animals that are highly efficient. From the production of cows and bulls for customers and cattle for the feedlot. 
gates, tubs and alleyways.

not rely on extra inputs. Dubas Cattle Co believe this is how most of our customers expect their cattle to perform. They find no reason to run cows any differently from the ones who are buying their genetics to put in their herds and expect their cattle to thrive in any operation.

Over the past few years Dubas Cattle Co has been retaining 90% of their yearling bull crop to market them as virgin two-year-old bulls. By doing this, they hope to offer their customers a more mature and developed herd bull. One item to note is they do not offer creep to the bulls they are retaining. The bull's winter on ground hay and silage and then go to grass the next spring to grow naturally. They receive supplemented cake every two weeks while on grass. The Dubas have found this helps their disposition.

The Dubas Cattle Co annual bull sale is held the first Saturday March. This year they will be offering around 50 fall and two-year-old Angus and Red Angus bulls. They will also have a nice selection of females ranging from open heifers to pairs. For Dubas Cattle Co they plan to aim to build upon their clientele and continue to supply existing customers with everyday cattle that go to work for them.

RENZEN ANGUS Roots Running Deep

Frenzen roots run deep in the Cedar River Valley northwest of Fullerton. Galen's great-grandfather Hans Frenzen, an immigrant from Germany, settled in the valley with his family in 1902. Galen's grandfather Frank Frenzen came to the farm where Galen and his family now live on March 1, 1929. Other than for his years in college, this is the only place Galen has lived.

The Frenzens have always been in the cattle business. The first registered Herefords were added in 1952 as 4-H and FFA projects for Marlin and Galen. Commercial Angus cross females were added in 1968. Registered Angus made their appearance in 1979 when Galen married Gwen Logan, the daughter of the late Harold, Sr. and Dorothy Logan of Blackgates Angus Farms at Diller,

Nebraska. Galen and Gwen's family consists of their son Eric, daughter Genna and her daughters Kiera and Kinsley Bremer, daughter Tessa, and her husband Cody Adams and their children Austry, Clint, and Cash.

The first registered Angus were a few select bred heifers purchased at complete and mature cow dispersions. Emphasis was on soundness, milk, fertility, and performance. Originally, Galen was in partnership with his brother Marlin, and lifelong friend, Dr. Loren Faaborg of Scottsbluff. Marlin passed away in 1992 and the partnership with Loren was dissolved in 1995. The operation is now owned and operated entirely by Galen, Gwen, and their son Eric. There are approximately 350 registered Angus, both spring and fall calving, along with 150 registered Polled Herefords. Farm land consists of irrigated and dry land corn and soybeans plus dryland alfalfa. Irrigation water is surface water permitted from the Cedar River.

The herd has always been rigidly culled with emphasis on fertility, calving ease, performance, milk, soundness, and positive carcass traits. No creep is fed to any of the calves and all cows are expected to bring in a big calf on their own and breed back with very little supplemental feed – except when the snow gets deep. The operation has always been on the AHIR programs with whole herd

reporting. Extensive A.I. has been used along with embryo transfer. All animals are ultra-sounded as yearlings for carcass information and EPD accuracy. Top herd sires have been purchased and sires have been selected from within their own herd. New genetics are incorporated primarily through A.I. Current herd sires include: Kraye Medicine Man 9101, Kraye Transformer JK 9363, Frenzen Entrust E72, Frenzen Galaxy G108, and Frenzen Medicine Man J42.

An annual production sale is held the fourth Tuesday in March where spring, fall yearling, and two-year old bulls are sold. Also selling are select yearling and bred heifers, plus two-year old pairs. Females and club calves are also available at private treaty. Younger bulls are kept back specifically for private treaty later in the year. All sale bulls are genomically tested to improve the accuracy of EPD's. We use EPD's as a tool. We are not a numbers chaser. New this year is an online bred heifer and elite genetic package sale on December 11, 2022 on Lowderman Auction Options.

The family of Travis and Emilee Kuhn including daughters Clara, Camryn, and Collins, and Travis's parents Kurt and Kristen Kuhn are located near Clarks, Nebraska. They manage around 250 head of Angus cows. 200 head of these cows are

registered with 50 head being commercial. With raising Angus cattle, they also operate 2,500 acres of corn, soybeans, native grass, and alfalfa hay. They produce all of their winter feed and grain, and whatever they do not use is marketed through the local elevator and ethanol plant.

Kurt began raising Angus cattle in 1980s' and was selling bulls through a private treaty under Mr. K Angus. Kurt and Kristen are still extremely involved and a vital part of the operation. Travis graduated from Fort Hays State in 2011 with a degree in Animal Science. After graduation he spent time working for Schaff Angus Valley and Poss Angus, before returning home to farm and raise cattle alongside Kurt. When Travis and his wife Emilee returned home, they started T&E Angus and run a joint production sale with Mr. K Angus. Since this time, they have doubled the size of the registered herd through extensive AI and embryo transfer. The cows run on summer grass that is all located within a sixmile radius of the ranch and are wintered on corn stalks. In the spring they graze rye. The calves are weaned at the beginning of September and are backgrounded at the ranch until sale time.

The base of the cow herd originates from Schaff Angus Valley, Sitz Angus, TK Angus, and Poss Angus. Sires that have left a lasting impact on their herd are Connealy Capitalist, SAV Renown, and Poss Maverick, as well as the owned herd sires including, TK Investment C894, MK Thick Cut, and WAR Calvary BO63. Each spring they AI around 200 cows and heifers to lead sire

Wagonhammer is currently owned and managed by Jim's son, Jay and his family including his wife Susie, sons Mitch and Alex, daughter Hilary and her husband Ryan Opdahl and granddaughter Willa. Jay serves in numerous leadership positions in the community and is a past president of the Nebraska Cattlemen.

The Wagonhammer operation is currently comprised of 800 registered Angus cows, 150 registered Charolais cows and 1,500 commercial cows between three ranches in Bartlett, NE; a 5,400 head feedlot in Albion and 1,300 irrigated crop acres between the locations.

Wagonhammer's greatest strength is its team of people and the tireless effort and extraordinary talent they bring to the organization. Joe Epperly oversees genetics and sales for the registered and commercial herds. 2005, Mark and Aliscia Benes established Gateway Genetics with Mark's brother and his wife. They marketed show cattle and breeding stock. In 2010, Mark and Aliscia purchased their neighbor's Simmental herd that also consisted of a few Angus cows. Much success came from that herd showing and marketing Simmental and Sim-Angus genetics on a national level, winning both the Purebred and Percentage Pen of Three Bulls at the National Western Livestock Show. It was 2017 when the decision was made from Mark and Aliscia to split from Gateway Genetics to form Circle B Livestock LLC. With having Simmental cows more Angus cattle were incorporated in the herd along with the horses and dogs. The company currently runs a little over 100 registered cows and puts in 30-50 embryos each year. Circle B Livestock LLC is made up of and strives to develop balanced, functional registered cattle, cutting horses, and working border collies.

At Circle B Livestock LLC, they take advantage of marketing their animals on the internet. They have an online show calf sale in September that is focused more for the junior exhibitors. They have an online female sale in December and the bulls they sell are displayed at the Boone County Fairgrounds the last weekend in February and are marketed through an online bull sale.

As for goals they try to keep their goals simple. They want to produce and develop the most fault free, functional cattle with a balance of maternal and carcass traits. They want to be in "it" for the long haul by establishing an operation that can produce a successful herd that can be handed down to the next generation.

Located near Belgrade, Nebraska, Scott Angus Cattle have been in the business for 40 years. Leonard Scott first settled there in the 1930's where he raised and sold plow pulling draft horses. As for their breeding program, Scott Angus Cattle AI the virgin heifers and registered cows. They utilize their commercial cows as embryo transfer recipients and calve from December to March. The genetics used predominantly are SAV herd sires, but this year they introduced Sitz Angus sires as well. The operation currently offers private treaty sales for registered cows, virgin heifers, bred heifers, late bred cows, and yearling bulls. Commercial calves are weaned in the fall. Heifers are evaluated for herd replenishment or sale, and steer calves are marketed.

The short-term goals for the operation include looking to improve the registered herd by their elite female purchases in the last couple years. Sitz Pride 200B (Stellar's Dam), WMS Blackcap May 9010 (2397 daughter), SAV Blackcap May 4574 (flush sister to Regard), Baldridge Pratissa J932 (Pappy daughter), and Linz Lady 116-8213 (890 daughter) were added with the future in mind by creating a trifecta of Sitz, Schaff, and Baldridge progeny. They plan to continue the embryo project with SAV to raise quality bull and heifer calves. Following this goal, they hope in time to hold their own annual bull and female sale for Scott Angus Cattle and build a strong foundation that can be succeeded by future Scott generations.



each year," said Kara Lee, director of producer engagement for CAB®. "BLI provides a unique opportunity to explore all facets of the beef industry, while also learning from and forging connections with fellow attendees."

Participants began the week at the American Angus Association in St.

Joseph, Missouri. While at the breed's headquarters, attendees met with staff to learn about the many departments and programs housed within the Association. Several Association employees offered insights, including Mark McCully, American Angus Association chief executive officer,

Following their time in St. Joseph, attendees visited Tiffany Cattle Company in Herrington, Kansas. Attendees learned how their decisions, specifically as seedstock producers, can influence cattle's performance in the feedyard.

For the second portion of the trip, the group traveled to Ohio to continue studying the beef value chain. Participants explored the impact of genetics in the beef industry at Select Sires, and the role value-added products play in marketing CAB® at Hudson Meat Company. The final days of the experience were spent at the CAB® brand headquarters in Wooster, Ohio.




Later that evening, the women enjoyed a social with a meal and wine making presentation at Van Till Family Farm Winery.
